Background

The Wissett Community Council was established on 7th March 1989 and many of the original purposes have been fulfilled over the years. Fund-raising opportunities have recently been reduced by the urgent need for major works on the Wissett Village Hall.

The need for the Community Council is now considerably reduced, particularly by the presence of a more active Parish Council and Village Hall Committee, and its purpose is no longer required.

Since the meeting of the above Council, held on 30th April 2019, there have been no volunteers coming forward to fill the vacant committee posts, therefore leading to the decision to consider dissolving the organisation.

The Suffolk History Society are advertising for local recorders.

The principal aim is to collect, observe and record what is happening today in the parish as that will become tomorrow's history. The Recorder does not need to have lived in the parish for years, or be a historian.

Being a Recorder involves merely collecting and recording the history of the parish today, *for tomor-row.*

Basically, we ask for the collection of any parish magazine, leaflets, election papers, to list the organisations in the parish, cut out relevant newspaper cuttings and note any changes such as the closure/ opening of shops, new buildings etc.

We ask only two things, that the Recorders are on-line to aid communication, and, that they submit a short report each year. This can just be two sides of A4 (or more) summarising the activities in the parish, and should be sent to us electronically or by mail. The reports are then deposited into the Suffolk Record Office.

We supply a Starter's Pack to new Recorders which is a guide to the role and ideas that could be carried out - it is always available on our website. – <u>www.slhc.org.uk</u>.

September 11th will be Gift Day: I do not like mentioning money, but the Treasurer has to, and our income has been much reduced by the Covid pandemic, so please take this opportunity to help us through another year. 11th is also the day of the Historic Churches Bike Ride. The average number of riders for Wissett has been about one recently, and he has another engagement this year; choosing some churches and cycling round to them is a nice way of spending the day, and raising sponsorship money for the church: do think of joining – details next month.

The PCC met in the church on 8th July, narrowly avoiding a criminal offence by realising at the eleventh hour that more than six of us could not meet in The Lodge as planned.

We look forward to meeting Rev Dominic Doble, who will be instituted as Team Rector on 10th August. It might be legal to sing by then, though we will still have to rely on recorded music: George Long played the left hand on the organ, with Jenny Ball on the right, but he has now moved to Norfolk, and no replacement for one or both hands, and even pedals as well, is in sight. We also need more people to lead the intercessions at most services.

It is mildly embarrassing not to have a plan of the graves in the churchyard, and also a shame not to have recorded the historic but eroding inscriptions on the stones. A plan was made some years ago, but the only copies disappeared. Now Mary Pester is going to make a new one, when she has short breaks from looking after her large vicarage garden. Nick Evans.
