Village Hall repairs and improvements

These were nearly completed. Consideration was being given to lighting improvements. The chairman and trustees were thanked and commended for their work and the high standard achieved.

Flooding of road at Sugar Nunn's Hill near Valley Farm. Suffolk County Council to be asked yet again to clear the culvert.

Tree planting at Village field

Volunteers had planted whips and cleared hedge areas.

Reading out the names of Wissett's fallen. Last Post. Not old, as we grow old. Remember.

Patronal feast. St Andrew's Day. The sandwiches are fishy, shall we say?

The church now decked with shining greenery. Holly and ivy. Spangled Christmas tree. It's carol service. Christmas evensong. Lit-bright with gently moving candlelight. Crowded, convivial congregation, loud. Warmth and smiling friendship, Christmas cheer. And all the people gladly sing along. The final marker in our village year.
