
After a break of 3 years, it will be on July 1st. Classes including flowers, vegetables, kitchen produce, flower arranging, and photography.

WISSETT PARISH COUNCIL

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

Held before the Parish Council Meeting on 18th May 2023...

The chairman gave his report of the finances and developments over the year.

He thanked the members of the Parish Council and the County and District Councillors for their help, support and time over the last year.

THE PARISH COUNCIL met immediately after the Annual Parish Meeting.

Frank Burton was elected Chair and Matthew Wetmore Deputy Chair unanimously. All duly signed the acceptance of office declarations which were witnessed by the Parish Clerk.

Items under consideration were:

- i) <u>VAS equipment</u> is in use every 2 months
- ii) Grays Lane proposed solar farm. There are still holding objections from various consultees. It is not known when it will go to the Planning Committee, but it will be after the new Local Government officials have been appointed and trained. Our Chairman is to meet the planners.
- iii) Cost of living Crisis Scheme. The Plough closed at the end of April so we no longer have a "warm room" in Wissett. The budget for 2023/24 will remain in place.
- iv) The Beck outside the Village Hall has suffered a further collapse. Neither Highways or the Environment Agency accepts responsibility to repair.
- v) The land near Rumburgh, owned by the Parish has a new tenant.
- vi) Planning applications. There were no objections raised.

Neighbourhood Plan

Melanie Seabrook and Ruth Bishop from East Suffolk Council presented the outline of the process for developing a Neighbourhood Plan and the assistance and grants available. It was resolved to further defer a final decision if to proceed until the next meeting, during which time the Parish Councillors would canvass opinions of Parishioners and ask for volunteers to become involved in the process. A neighbourhood plan based on Wissett would allow parishioners to have a greater say in how land in the parish is developed. It is an opportunity for the village to indicate what its priorities are in developing and maintaining all the land in our area; not just the Conservation area. Villagers are asked to contact the Parish Clerk indicating what their priorities are for future development and whether they would be willing to assist in the formulation of the plan in conjunction with the Parish Council and East Suffolk planning specialists.

The Annual Budget was reviewed

BIRDSONG IN WISSETT

There seem to be so many birds singing in Wissett this spring! I wondered what some of them were so I downloaded an App called Mer-

lin on my phone; I never need to wonder again. A walk from the bottom of Wash Lane to Spexhall Church and back recorded many usual and unusual birds: chaffinch, robin, blackbird, wren, blackcap, chiffchaff, yellow hammer, greenfinch two sorts of woodpecker, swallow, collared dove, sparrow, woodpigeon, jackdaws blue tit, great tit, garden warbler and a tree creeper.

Another walk, from the bottom of Wash Lane through the Christmas trees, along Mill Road and back round the lakes found a few more: greater whitethroat, skylark, reed warbler, coal tit, jay, magpie, carrion crow plus plus plus!

We know there have been turtle doves in the village in the recent past and last year a wryneck was spotted. If you have the right sort of phone, download MERLIN, free and enjoy Wissett birdsong, not just the joy of returning swifts as they scream up and down the Street. Ed. ********

GREEN FUNCTIONS
