WISSETT PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council met on Monday, 9th January.

Items under consideration were:

i) The faulty VAS system has been returned to Brampton for repair.

ii)The ANPR system was in Wissett on 12th January.

iii) Gravs Lane proposed solar farm.

There had been a visit from Heritage, Trees and Planning, who walked the proposed site and were surprised at the actual size of the proposal and its potential impact.

iv) Cost of Living Crisis Scheme.

The grant had been received to support the Plough public house opening early on Thursdays to provide a warm environment, with tea, coffee and board games.

v)The Beck.

The further collapse was reported to the Environment Agency. Someone from the Agency has now seen the damage and reported to their Asset Performance Team.

Planning Applications:

DC/21/4863/FUL

Lilac Lodge, The Street. "Renovation of existing 1980's house with two modern extensions. Incorporating existing garage, providing new ground floor study and kitchen/dining room. Additional ensuite bathroom to master bedroom and ensuite to bedroom 2 and roof terrace." The Parish Council objected on the grounds that the development is too large for the site.

Resolutions

It was resolved that, due to the potential tenant withdrawing from the rental of the land near Rumburgh, to ask a previous interested party prior to re-advertising.

All other questions were deferred until the next meeting.

Potholes in the Village Car Park to be looked at and quotes obtained to be considered at the next meeting

SAVE GRAYS LANE CAMPAIGN

PLANNING APPLICATION East Suffolk Council (ESC) are continuing to assess the planning application submitted by the developer PACE. It appears that this process will take much longer than anticipated and there is a view that the final planning committee meeting may not take place until after the local elections in early May. In the meantime, there have been a number of helpful developments:

FIRE Suffolk Fire and Rescue Service have written to ESC expressing their concerns about the significant potential danger of fire and toxic fumes that might occur in the 20+ battery storage containers that PACE propose installing on the site. The SFRS explain that current proposals are wholly inadequate; their letter is available at **savegrayslane.org**

CONSULTEES The planners are working with a number of statutory consultees and are awaiting definitive responses from most of them. For example, the response from English Heritage commented only on mitigating the impact of the development on the moated site at Brook Hall, which is a scheduled ancient monument. They ignored the impact the site will have on the other 30 listed buildings and their place in the landscape. The Save Grays Lane Steering Group and our Parish Council have sent several letters asking English Heritage to reconsider their position.

LANDSCAPE ESC has its own internal Heritage Department to oversee the protection of heritage landscapes and buildings in the area in accordance with national and local policies. The senior heritage officer and the planning case officer have visited the Grays Lane site to better understand the impact that the development will have on the area. We are hopeful that their recommendations will support our contention that this development is in completely the wrong location.

FUNDING Most of the £9,500 that was raised by many of you supporting the campaign has been spent on fees for experts and on local publicity. The remaining sum of £1,621 is being kept to help fund the publicity that will be required leading up to the ESC public planning committee meeting.
